Ray,

Please send out another plea ! Still a bit short on food !

What could be more important than feeding the hungry?

Our Scouts and parents have the opportunity to feed the homeless through St. Paul's church in Dayton on the second Saturday of every other month. This is a joint project with our Troop sponsor, Aley UMC. The troop is responsible for providing 10 to 12 egg casseroles (recipe can be found on troop web site) plus dry cereal, fruit, orange juice, milk. Church members provide a potato casserole to go with the breakfast, as well as fruit, juice, milk.

The average number of people fed is 120 to 145. We could use a few more egg casseroles !

Food drop offs are either on Friday around 7:30P.M. by the scout hut or on Saturday morning - 7:30 A.M. We meet at Aley at 7:30 A.M., load up with food/scouts/adult leadership and proceed to St Paul's. Breakfast set up takes about an hour or so - food is served around 9:00 and by 10:30 we are done with the feeding and clean up. In addition to doing a "good deed", Scouts can earn service hours by preparing the food or by serving at St. Paul's (1 hour per casserole for preparation and up to 3 hours for helping serve). One to three scouts are needed to help serve and clean up.

This project is one of our Troop's mainstay community projects but it can't happen without parent support. Please provide whatever items you can to help feed the homeless. Show your Scout how to celebrate Christmas by giving someone in need a decent breakfast courtesy of Troop 71.
