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> Ray,  
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> Our Scouts and parents have the opportunity to feed the homeless through  
> St. Paul's church in Dayton on the second Saturday of every other month.  
> This is a joint project with our Troop sponsor, Aley UMC. The troop is  
> responsible for providing 10 to 12 egg casseroles (recipe can be found on  
> troop web site) plus dry cereal, fruit, orange juice, milk. Church  
> members provide a potato casserole to go with the breakfast, as well as  
> fruit, juice, milk.  
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> The average number of homeless people fed is 120 to 145. The next "Feed  
> the Homeless" date is 14 Feb 2015.  
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> Food drop offs are either on Friday around 7:30P.M. by the scout hut or on  
> Saturday morning - 7:30 A.M. We meet at Aley at 7:30 A.M., load up with  
> food/scouts/adult leadership and proceed to St Paul's. Breakfast set up  
> takes about an hour or so - food is served around 9:00 and by 10:30 we are  
> done with the feeding and clean up. In addition to doing a "good deed",  
> Scouts can earn service hours by preparing the food or by serving at St.  
> Paul's (1 hour per casserole for preparation and up to 3 hours for helping  
> serve). One to three scouts are generally needed to help serve and clean  
> up.

> This project is one of our Troop's mainstay community projects but it  
> can't happen without parent support. Please provide whatever items you can  
> to help feed the homeless.  
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>
